Rachel Singer Gordon's latest book offers guidance to a new generation of librarians, draws on survey data to show a profession in transition and incompatible with long-standing stereotypes

March 22, 2006, Washington, DC—At the opening of the 21st annual Computers in Libraries conference and exhibition, Information Today, Inc. (ITI) announced the publication of *The NextGen Librarian's Survival Guide*. This new book by Rachel Singer Gordon, a popular library industry writer and speaker, was written to support the wave of next generation librarians that is transforming the library landscape.
